**Administrative history note:** On 10 February 1992 Council disestablished the schools of Surgery and Medicine and created in their place "teaching-hospital-based Clinical Schools" (resolution CL92/04b). Thus the Prince Henry / Prince of Wales Clinical School came into being within the Faculty of Medicine, containing the "existing hospital-based departments of Medicine, Surgery, Traumatic & Orthopaedic Surgery and Anaesthetics & Intensive Care" (file 911991). The first Clinical Associate Dean of the school was Professor J. M. Ham.

The closure of Prince Henry Hospital had been announced in September 1988 with services to be gradually moved to Prince of Wales Hospital. It was not, however, until the end of 2002 that this transfer process was complete. Thus at this time the clinical school began to be known as the Prince of Wales Clinical School (file 011053).

In 2008 the Clinical Associate Dean of the Prince of Wales Clinical School was Professor Philip Crowe.
